# REPORT FROM NEW YORKERS FOR CONSTITUTIONAL FREEDOMS

Governor Paterson is still pushing for Senate vote on same-sex marriage (potentially in a special session within a few weeks). Paterson <u>told</u> a group of reporters that the Senate Coup left "a number of unfinished issues" and that "I don't see any reason not to address them."

The Governor met with legislative leaders this week to <u>discuss</u> the budget. They agreed to his plan to cut \$500 million from state agencies, but signaled that they would fight cuts to schools (\$480 million) and health care (\$500 million). It now appears unlikely that the New York State Legislature will return before the election (November 3).

The State has a real problem with <u>collecting taxes</u> on sales of cigarettes on the Indian reservations. The topic was brought up at the legislative Leaders meeting this week, and the Governor indicated that he had sent a letter to federal prosecutors for a "threat assessment." The last time New York State tried to force the Indians to pay taxes, it resulted in tire fires and the blocking of state roads

# PUTTING THE BRAKES ON PAY HIKES FOR NEW PLATES

County clerks have launched a series of petition drives to protest the newest financial toll facing New Yorkers: a requirement that, starting in April, motorists must buy new \$25 license plates when their vehicle registrations come

"I've got close to 2,000 signatures already," said Rensselaer County's Frank Merola, one of a growing handful of county clerks offering paper or online petitions protesting the mandated license plates and their attendant cost."Not a customer up here thinks they need to replace the plates," said Merola, who echoed several other clerks in describing state license and registration fees as "cash cows" for the state. Drivers licenses, good for eight years, are also rising this year to \$64.50, up from \$50. And a two-year registration for a car is going up from an average \$44 to \$55.

#### NEW YORKERS MOVING TO FLORIDA

The Empire Center for New York State Policy has a new report out today which details the ongoing population drain in New York, especially upstate. While New York shares with California the distinction of being the only state to lose more than 1 million people since 2000, the Empire State actually saw some net gain thanks to the continuing influx of immigrants, largely settling in New York City. Most of those leaving head to the warmer, and more tax-friendly states down South with Florida being the biggest draw by a good margin.

The annual net loss of New Yorkers to other states has ranged from a high of nearly 250,000 people in 2005 to a low of 126,000 last year, when moves nationwide slowed down sharply along with the economy. California was the only other state to lose more than a million residents to out-migration during the 2000-2008 period.
