C.S. Lewis was simply communicating the Gospel truth that if we received what we truly deserve we would all be burning in Hell. Because we are all sinners that's the only thing we have a legitimate right to; anything more is a bonus. How does that principle affect our relationships? If I expect dinner on the table at six o'clock sharp each night, when it's there I don't get too excited, because after all, it's expected. If it isn't there, look out! I get angry and everybody pays! Now if I don't expect it, and it's not there, I won't get upset; I didn't expect it. If it is on the table, wow! A bonus! I'll appreciate it because I didn't expect it. Apply the same principle to every part of your relationship, and you'll see that most of your anger and frustration comes because you're not getting something you expect, which you think you have a right to. Lower your expectations. If you expect nothing, then everything will be received as a gift. Your heart will reflect gratitude. That's where we want to be. Be careful not to insist on what you deserve. You might get it as C.S. Lewis reminds us. Be grateful. Be thankful, and begin working together from that place of mutual appreciation. If you woke up this morning to discover you were not burning in Hell, then you're already ahead of the game. Everything else is a bonus. So make no expectations or demands, but receive one another as a gift of God's grace.
