Honor One Another

"Love must be sincere. Hate what is evil; cling to what is good. Be devoted to one another in brotherly love. Honor one another above yourselves."

--Romans 12:10

Honor. That's not a word we hear too often in modern culture. Yet it is the very foundation of a lasting relationship. Without honor there can be no mutual respect. Without mutual respect there can be no intimacy. Without intimacy there is no real relationship.

What does it mean to honor one another? It means to acknowledge ones' presence with a sense of awe. How would you respond if the most highly respected person you could think of walked into the room you were in? How would you respond to Jesus if he walked into the room? You would probably stand up as your mouth dropped open in awe. Wow! It's really Him! Hold on to that picture. That's the way we should respond to our spouse as they enter the room. Treat one another, in the moment-by-moment events of the day, like they are the most important person in the world to you. They are. Then remember, "What you do to the least of these brethren you do to me" --Jesus.
